National Apprenticeship Week (NAW) is a nationwide celebration established in 2015 by the U.S. Department of Labor that brings together leading business, labor, education, and other critical partners to showcase the impact apprenticeship programs have on addressing the U.S. skills gap and unleashing the American workforce.

Who Should Participate?

NAW is for everyone – from employers to educators to other critical partners that support and complement the path to apprenticeship. NAW is an annual opportunity to put the spotlight on these apprenticeship champions that are creating the future of work.

Why Participate?

NAW gives employers the opportunity to showcase their programs, facilities, and apprentices, and career seekers the opportunity to learn more about the benefits of apprenticeship and the programs available in their communities.

How to Participate?

Join apprenticeship champions from across the U.S. by **hosting an event**, **signing and submitting a proclamation**, or **attending an event in your community**.

What Constitutes an Event?

Hosts representing diverse industries from across the U.S. have put the spotlight on apprenticeship through apprenticeship graduations, career fairs, open house/facility tours, skills competitions, roundtables, and more.
